SELLING THE "CHAMETZ"

The Torah forbids a Jew to own any chametz (bread, cake, beer, etc.) during Passover, so we sell all chametz (left after the search and burning) to a non-Jew, with a rabbi acting as our agent. The non-Jewish buyer gives a small deposit, and the balance becomes a guaranteed loan. The sale of chametz transaction is legally binding, but the buyer may return it and retrieve his deposit. Place all chametz utensils in a specific room or closet(s) to be sold, sealed with tape or lock, until after Passover.

Rabbi Mendel Lifshitz also has the full power and right to act as he deems fit and proper in accordance with all the details of the Bill of Sale used in the transaction to sell all my chametz, chametz mixtures, etc., as provided herein. This power is in conformity with all Torah, Rabbinic and Civil laws.
